TEMPORARY PROTECTED STATUS (TPS) - SYRIA



ARE YOU FROM SYRIA?

If you are from Syria or lived in Syria you might qualify for temporary protected status (TPS). If you already have TPS, get more information <u>here</u>.

WHAT IS TEMPORARY PROTECTED STATUS (TPS):

Temporary Protected Status (TPS) is for people who left their home countries because of conflict or natural disasters. The U.S government decides which countries are on the TPS list.

A person with TPS:

- is protected from deportation,
- can work legally in the United States, and
- may travel with permission.

TPS for people from Syria ends September 30, 2022. TPS can be extended. The U.S. government announces <u>extensions</u> and when to sign up again ("re-register").

DO YOU QUALIFY FOR TPS? YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR TPS IF:

- You are from Syria or you lived in Syria;
- You came to the U.S. by March 19, 2021; and
- You apply for TPS by September 30, 2022.

NOTE: Some trips outside the U.S., crimes, or other problems can disqualify you from TPS.
